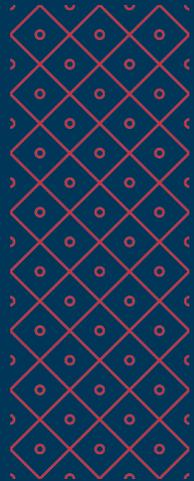


Free Movement of Persons



Free movement of persons

*Historically: the European **Economic** Community only allowed free movement of people in terms of the movement of "factors of production"*

*Maastricht Treaty: introduced **citizenship of the Union** and with it a status recognised by EU law independent of a person's economic activity*

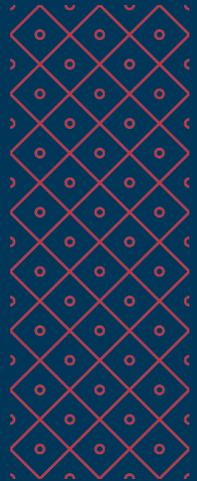

C-135/08, *Rottmann* - facts




Janko Rottmann was originally an Austrian citizen who acquired German citizenship by naturalization and lost his Austrian citizenship at the same time. However, in violation of German law (probably fraudulently), he did not indicate on his naturalization form that he was being prosecuted in Austria. When the German authorities learned of this, they retroactively revoked his citizenship. He was thus to become an apatriote.

Mr Rottmann brought an administrative action against this decision. The German court decided to ask a preliminary question in order to verify whether the possible loss of EU citizenship is covered by EU law.

C-135/08, *Rottmann* - decision



CJEU: Deprivation of rights deriving from EU citizenship has consequences in terms of EU law, and the CS must respect EU law when exercising its powers. On the grounds of fraud, annulment of a naturalisation decision is legitimate but must comply with the principle of proportionality. ***"In this respect, it must be verified in particular whether the loss is justified in view of the gravity of the unlawful act of the person concerned, the time elapsed between the decision to grant citizenship and the decision to revoke the act by which citizenship was granted, and the possibility for the person concerned to regain his or her original nationality."*** (C-135/08, *Rottmann*, paragraph 56.)

Citizens' Rights Directive

Personal scope

- EU citizen exercising his right of FM
- Family members accompanying the EU citizen
- Automatic family members under Art. 2(2) Dir. 2004/38/EC
- Discretion for beneficiaries under Art. 3(2) Dir. 2004/38/EC

Right of residence

- Up to 3 months
- For more than 3 months – sufficient resources, health insurance
- Permanent residence
